Medicare & Uncompensated Care Update for 2018

Identifying and Reducing Diabetic-Related Foot Amputations in District 3

Course#: 180910 CPE: 1.0 Level: Entry Prerequisites: None

A tenet of this project is that socioeconomic factors underlie a large percentage of a person's health and well-being. A number of our team members have dedicated their careers to addressing these disparities and are now focused on District 3, one person, one family, one community at a time. Drs. Lyssa Ochoa and Anil Mangla have identified a vicious cycle of poverty and lack of health insurance, depression, use of the ER for a health care service, and poor diabetes management as primary contributors to the high amputation rate in District 3 [medical health records]. This project's strategy will implement a comprehensive care approach through regular home visits in an effort to realize four key project outcomes: 1.Reduction in ER visits after 1 year 2.Assisting, monitoring, and improving mental health which will improve HbA1c scores 3.Identifying economic benefit of the project 4.Reducing diabetic-related foot amputations after 1 year.
